1 John 4:7-19

¹⁰ This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins.’

The Bible says, “God is love,” meaning love is God’s essence. God does not only “possess” love or “will” love, but rather God loves. Period.

How God’s Love Is Presented

God’s Love Transforms
